AUDITION INFO

Performers in this show are portraying high school students, so an age range of 14 and above to mid 20's are encouraged to audition. Also, there is an older role of MISS LYNCH (teacher/principal) as well as VINCE FONTAINE (radio disc jockey). All auditioning should dress comfortably including shoes, (not flip flops or sandals) for stage dancing. Be prepared to sing a cutting of your choice from a Broadway score about 16 measures and please bring a COPY for the accompanist. (music must have accompaniment). You will be asked to sing and dance and readings will be determined if necessary. Please come out to audition for a powerful show with high energy and great music that will take you back to a simpler time of teen idols, rock and roll music, and high school dreams

CHARACTERS TO CONSIDER:

DANNY: The leader of the "Burger Palace Boys". Well built, nice looking with an air of cool easy-going charm. Strong and confident with a strong stage voice.

SANDY: Danny's love interest. Sweet, wholesome, naive, cute, like Sandra Dee of the "Gidget" movies. Also, a strong stage voice, and presence.

RIZZO: Leader of the "Pink Ladies" She is tough, sarcastic, and outspoken but vulnerable.

FRENCHY: A dreamer. Good-natured and not too smart. She can't wait to finish high school and be a beautician.

MARTY: The beauty of the "Pink Ladies". Tries to act sophisticated

JAN: Compulsive eater. Loud and pushy with the girls, but shy with the boys.

KENICKIE: Second in command of the "Burger Palace Boys". Tough-looking, surly, avoids any show of softness. Has an off-beat sense of humor.

DOODY: Youngest of the guys. Small, boyish with a disarming smile and a hero-worshipping attitude toward the other guys. He also plays the guitar and should have a smooth voice.

ROGER: The anything for a laugh kind of guy. Full of mischief, and enjoys putting people on.

SONNY: Italian looking, with shiny black hair. A braggart who thinks he's a real lady killer.

OTHER ROLES:

PATTY: A typical cheerleader type. She can also twirl a baton.

CHA-CHA: A blind date. Takes pride in being the BEST DANCER at St. Bernadette's.

EUGENE: The class Valedictorian. An apple polisher, smug and pompous but gullible.

VINCE FONTAINE: A typical teen audience "DISC JOCKEY". A former "greaser"

JOHNNY CASINO: A "greaser" student at Rydell High who leads a rock and roll band .

TEEN ANGEL: A good looking falsetto voiced, Fabian look-alike. A smooth singer who would have caused girls to scream and riot in 1958.

MISS LYNCH: A typical high school English teacher.
